Chair Obijiski called the meeting to order at approximately 5:20 and asked the clerk to call the roll.

Public Comment

Ms. Hartman shared a grid she created (attached) showing the number of legislative districts in each town for the maps that were discussed on December 20th as a point of information.

Chair Obijiski shared information from Attorney Michael Cook regarding questions that were directed to the court. The first was in regard to granting possible exceptions to the open meeting laws to allow Commissioners to attend remotely from non-public locations such as the gate of an airport or while traveling in a car. This request was denied. The second question was in regard to allowing the Commission to potentially offer two draft maps for the public hearing on December 27th. The judge said they could if they chose to.

Chair Obijiski then restated the meeting schedule that included the Public Hearing on December 27th, the hearing remaining open for 24 hours after that for written public comment on December 28th, a meeting of the Commission on December 29th to review public comment and if necessary another meeting on December 30th. He was hopeful the Commissioners could finalize a map on December 29th. The last deliverable was the submission of a final map to the Board of Election on or before January 3.

The Commissioners discussed pros and cons of several maps and narrowed the selection to 4. Then each commissioner ranked their top two choices from those 4.

The Commissioners discussed presenting one or two maps at the Public Hearing on December 27. They reached a consensus that this might be confusing to the public and agreed to present just one map.

Commissioner Monk expressed his frustration that at the mapping discussion the last time because it was his understanding that they could always make some modification for the final map after the public hearing. However, some modifications were dismissed by his fellow commissioners because the public did not have an opportunity to comment on them. He clarified that parts of other maps and/or suggestions for modifications to

this map would still be considered as options even if they were not part of the map presented at the public hearing.

Motion No. 1: To present the map titled Travrask1 created by Commissioner Rask for the

Public Hearing on December 27th and only present one map.
